# Learning

At Oakhill we follow a broad curriculum that is tailored to the individual. The academic achievement of each individual is recognised because the class sizes are small and there is only one class in each year group.

We follow national recommendations made by the Early Years Foundation Stage right up to the end of Key Stage 4 when our pupils sit their GCSEs. Modern Languages and Music are taught by specialist teachers from Nursery through to GCSE. In addition to the core subjects of English, English Literature, Maths, Core and Additional Science and RE, the following GCSE options are available: Art, Business Studies, Computing, Design and Technology, French, History, ICT, Geography, Latin, Music, P.E., Spanish and Triple Science (Physics, Chemistry and Biology). We believe that pupils respond to a range of teaching and learning styles and we encourage both traditional and innovative approaches. From Key Stage 2 upwards children are issued with personal iPads to extend their learning, presentation and independent research skills. We provide extensive opportunities with external speakers and educational visits so that our pupils can learn from their varied educational experience.

Pupils' progress is tracked from the Baby Room through to Year 11 and we use the data from baseline and internal assessments to ensure that each child is achieving or exceeding their potential. We are fortunate in having an excellent, well staffed and well resourced additional needs department who work alongside the children in lessons or provide individual and small group support.







# Caring

At Oakhill we pride ourselves on our pastoral care - the benefits of having a school family are clear as soon as you enter the grounds. It takes no time at all to get to know everyone and to feel safe and at home. The pupils quickly make friends with children from their own class and other year groups.

Another strength of the school is that we often have whole school events such as Learning Through Play Day, whole school walks, music concerts and school productions, which mean that the school often comes together to share and celebrate an experience – just like so many families do.

And just as in so many families when someone needs some help or extra attention there are a number of people around who will stop what they are doing and make time for

that person. We work hard to resolve problems and continue to keep a close eye on any emerging issues. We pride ourselves on our ability to identify potential difficulties before they escalate to become problems. There is a designated point of contact for parents from the key workers in the Nursery to class teachers in Prep and form teachers in the Senior School. We also have a school nurse, whom all the children know, and our approachable office staff, who get to know the children very well.
















### Teamwork

Working together is at the heart of an Oakhill education. There are many ways that we encourage this. All children from Reception upwards are placed in one of our two Houses: Martyrs or Scholars. Pupils earn points for their House through a reward system and there are also competitive interhouse events ranging from swimming and cross country to talent contests, spellathons and photography competitions. The importance of working with pupils outside of your year group is emphasised through the House System.

We rely on our older pupils in both Prep and Seniors to take on positions of responsibility as Prefects, Sports Captains, House Captains and Head Boy and Head Girl. These are highly regarded positions and an invaluable way of developing pupils' leadership skills. A notable feature of our happy school is the very effective Student Council, in both the Prep and Senior school. Two pupils from each class stand for election as student representatives and meet on a weekly basis with a member of staff to discuss student issues and concerns and to arrange fundraising activities for their chosen charities.

We are also lucky to have an active Chaplaincy Group with two voluntary members from each class who help serve the school through their important work in preparing class and whole school Masses and contributing to the faith life of the school. Parents, as well as staff and governors, are also involved as much as possible.

# Activities and Sport

As a small school what makes us unique is that we encourage participation from every member of the community in many different kinds of activity. We celebrate taking part and trying your best in everything. At Oakhill we recognise that learning is not just something that happens inside the classroom but also outside of the classroom.

The extra curricular activities and opportunities at Oakhill are outstanding. These range from a vast array of sporting and creative activities including gymnastics, dance, ballet, running, girls' rugby, enquiring minds, chess club, knitting, choirs and a range of musical groups.

We have activity weeks in the Prep and Senior schools and encourage the children to take part in day and residential trips to places such as Eureka and as far afield as Peru. There is a very popular annual ski trip and all Year 10 pupils usually take part in the Duke of Edinburgh's Bronze Award with many going on to take their Silver Award in Year 11.













### **Events**

Like any school we have a series of annual events which form part of school life and to which parents and family are warmly welcomed. We have traditional occasions such as the Senior Prize Giving, the Prep Final Assembly and Nursery Graduation. We also have a school Carol Concert and a nativity play performed by Pre school, Reception and Key Stage 1 pupils.

We know how offering pupils the chance to perform on the stage or in a sport can make a huge difference to their self-confidence and we encourage all pupils to participate in areas that they can achieve. We have a whole school musical production which alternates with a whole school performing arts concert.

Team sports take place on a regular basis and we encourage parents to go and support their children. We also have annual sporting events like Cross Country and Swimming Galas in both Prep and Seniors.

Perhaps the most popular events are the family events which form part of the Oakhill Calendar. We celebrate harvest in Prep with a Harvest Assembly and with a conker competition in Seniors. We have a well-attended community Bonfire with pie and peas supper included and we also hold a very successful Christmas Market. In the Summer Term we have afternoon tea and ice creams to celebrate the end of a successful school year.



## Oakhill Association

We know that we rely on a good relationship with parents to support our children in their learning and to give them the best start in life. We are very lucky to have an established parent teacher association that meets on a regular basis to organise special events such as world of wheels, roller discos, cookery clubs, teddy bears' picnic and plant sales both to involve families and raise money to provide additional resources for the school. All parents are automatically members of the association and are very welcome to attend the meetings or take part in supporting the events.

In recent years the association has provided the school with a redesigned play area for Pre school, a new wireless operating system for the school, iPads for teachers plus books and equipment for pupils in all areas of the school from Nursery through to the Senior School.

Helping out or supporting Oakhill Association events is a great way to get to know other parents and also support your children's education.
